Dear Governor Malloy:

Attached please find the quarterly report of operations of the Materials Innovation and Recycling Authority<sup>1</sup> (the "Authority") for the Fourth Quarter of Fiscal Year 2016 (April 1, 2016 through June 30, 2016) as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 22a-263 (the "Statute").

During Fiscal Year 2016, the Authority's operations consisted primarily of the Connecticut Solid Waste System (CSWS). The Authority began transitioning financial control of its Southeast Project to the Southeastern Connecticut Regional Resource Recovery Authority (SCRRA) in the first quarter of fiscal year 2016, and by the end of the second quarter; the Authority no longer recognized Southeast Project revenues or expenses on its financial statements. The Mid Connecticut Project remains active on the Authority's financial statements solely for project closeout activities. The Authority also maintains a Property Division and a Landfill Division for assets no longer in service to its projects. Therefore, the referenced Statute's requirements are reported separately for each project and division.

This includes only the 1992 Series A Corporate Credit Revenue Bonds. During fiscal year 2016, the Authority's Resource Recovery Revenue Refunding Bonds (Covanta Southeastern Connecticut Company Project – 2010 Series A) supported by a Special Capital Reserve Fund (SCRF) with the State, matured and were fully paid, as were two additional series of Corporate Credit Revenue Bonds. With maturity of the 2010 Series A Refunding Bonds, there is no longer any contingent liability of the State via a SCRF associated with the Authority.
