Notice is hereby given that the Materials Innovation and Recycling Authority (MIRA) (the “applicant”) of 200 Corporate Place, Suite 202, Rocky Hill, CT has submitted to the Department of Energy & Environmental Protection an application under section 22a-208a of the Connecticut General Statutes for a permit to conduct a regulated activity in the construction, alteration or operation of solid waste facilities.

Specifically, the applicant proposes to modify the Solid Waste Permit-to-Operate for the CSWS Resource Recovery Facility in order to conduct transfer of municipal solid waste (MSW) received at the facility, to other properly licensed solid waste management facilities in the event that combustion of MSW for energy recovery at the facility is suspended. The proposed activity will take place at 300 Maxim Road, Hartford, CT. The proposed activity will not affect natural resources as there will be no combustion of MSW and a reduction of vehicle traffic when transfer activities are conducted.
