#### Dear Governor Lamont:

As you know, Public Act 23-170 created the MIRA Dissolution Authority (the "Authority") as successor to the Materials Innovation and Recycling Authority (MIRA). The Authority replaced MIRA effective July 1, 2023 and is charged with undertaking and completing any action commenced by MIRA.

Attached please find the quarterly report of operations of MIRA for the Fourth Quarter of Fiscal Year 2023 (April 1, 2023 through June 30, 2023) as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 22a-263 (the "Statute").

MIRA operated the Connecticut Solid Waste System (CSWS) and separately maintained a Property Division and Landfill Division for reporting its other financial activities. The Authority's Mid-Connecticut project remained active only for close out purposes. Therefore, the Statute requirements are reported separately for each project and division.

Hartford landfill is certified closed as of 2/15. MIRA has installed, owns and operates a photovoltaic solar panel system location on a portion of the property and therefore MIRA has entered into a site access agreement with City of Hartford.
