Dear Governor Lamont:

Attached please find the quarterly report of operations of the MIRA Dissolution Authority (the "Authority") for the Second Quarter of Fiscal Year 2025 (October 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024) as required by Connecticut General Statutes Section 22a-263 (the "Statute").

The Authority operates the Connecticut Solid Waste System (CSWS) and separately maintains a Property Division and Landfill Division for reporting its other financial activities. The Authority's Mid-Connecticut project remains active only for close out purposes. Therefore, the Statute requirements are reported separately for each project and division.

Pursuant to Public Act 23-170, the Authority will terminate and the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) will become its successor effective June 30, 2025. Accordingly, the Authority will submit its report of operations through March 31, 2025 but not thereafter. In the event a 4th quarter report is determined necessary, DAS will need to prepare and submit same.

Hartford landfill is certified closed as of 2/15. MIRA has installed, owns and operates a photovoltaic solar panel system location on a portion of the property and therefore MIRA has entered into a site access agreement with City of Hartford.
